HAPPY NEW YEAR! I hope everyone had a blessed Christmas vacation! It's time to motivate our kiddos again to do their very best and be the very best version of themselves.

In December the whole school started their Safe Environment Training. Preschool students learned about safe/unsafe touches and how to use their big, strong voices to say "No!" and "Stop!".

Kindergarten through second grade learned all about "Don't Knows" through Safeside Superchick! Every kid should have at least 3 designated Safeside Adults. If you haven't already had that discussion with your kiddos, make sure you discuss who they can go to no matter what!

Grades 4 and 5 reviewed how God designed their body for them, how to follow their gut, and how to tell the difference between a safe/unsafe situation.

Middle school discussed boundaries and learned about what consent is in any relationship.

Take a minute:

Cultivating a growth mindset in students is crucial for their academic and personal development. Here are a few strategies to promote a growth mindset at home and in the classroom.

- I. Praise Effort, Not Intelligence: Encourage students by praising their hard work and intention not to give up too soon rather than simply praising their intelligence or talent.
- 2. Emphasize the Power of "Yet": Encourage students to use the word "yet" when they face challenges. Below are some examples of how changing your words can shift your perspectives.

Fixed Mindset: "I'm just not good at this, and I never will be."
Growth Mindset: "I may not understand this concept yet, but with effort and practice, I will get there."

Fixed Mindset: "I don't like to try new things because I might fail."

Growth Mindset: "I don't know how to do this yet."
